It is a Great Day to be a Tall Cedar!!



Bowlers from eight Forests representing six districts throughout the Cedar Kingdom participated in the tournament. The traveling award goes to Supreme Tall Cedar James Marion and Past Supreme Director William Ward, Jr., coming from Indiana and Georgia respectively.

Although this event was enjoyed by all who participated, the numbers were somewhat down from last year. Much thought and discussion among the Bowling Committee members has focused on increasing participation in the tournament. We have opened this event to our Cedarettes, Masonic youth and Master Masons, yet there has not been a significant change in participation. Realizing that it is becoming increasingly difficult (and expensive) to travel to events, the committee is considering the following changes to the rules and format of the Supreme Bowling Tournament:

- All bowling scores will be sent to the bowling committee by an agreed upon date
- Each entry will be accompanied by a preset fee
- Bowlers would be responsible to pay the bowling establishment
- The 3 game series would be bowled consecutively on the same day
- Awards would be distributed at the Tall Cedar Convention
- Teams could be organized within each Forest or District, or perhaps regionally

Between now and the next issue of the Cedar Digest our Committee hopes to finalize rules and the format of this event. We are encouraging Cedar members to offer feedback to the above changes and even propose additional ideas that would help to increase participation. Please feel free to respond.




