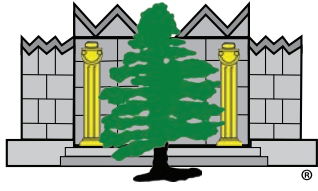

Tall Cedars and Ladies,

As I sit down to write this article, the robins are beginning to return to south central Pennsylvania, certainly a more accurate sign that winter is ending and spring is right around the corner than an overgrown rodent.

As a member of the Extension Committee, I have been thinking a great deal about expansion. I have long felt that we do not currently have the financial resources or membership numbers necessary to support international expansion. Maintaining communication with international Forests is difficult; unless one is willing to pay for overseas phone calls, which are expensive, we are limited to email or internet-based calls that require the use of an app. Unfortunately, using an app is not an option with the office phone.

That said, I recently discovered that we have Grand Lodge recognition in eight states—North Dakota, New Hampshire, New Mexico, Arizona, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, Washington State, and Colorado (for Members at Large only)—yet we have no Forests in any of those states. I also learned that we have four states with only one Forest and three states with only two Forests. In addition, there are several states where we are present but remain underdeveloped. Clearly, there is significant opportunity to open new Forests here within the United States.

Moving forward, I would like to see the Extension Committee focus primarily on expansion within the United States, particularly in states where we already have Grand Lodge recognition, as well as in other promising areas. It is far less costly for the Supreme Forest to open new Forests domestically than internationally, largely due to the travel expenses involved in sending Supreme Officers to conduct the openings. Communication with domestic Forests is also considerably easier.

Looking ahead, I would also like to see Supreme Tall Cedars establish a dedicated line item in the annual budget to fund travel for Line Officers or Extension Committee members. This would allow them to attend events such as the Conference of Grand Masters, Grand Lodge Communication meetings, or other gatherings of Grand Masters to seek recognition in states where we are not yet established.

Now that I have shared my thoughts on future expansion, I would like to address how we can grow not only in new states, but also by recruiting members throughout the Cedar Kingdom. Since the sole requirement for membership is that a man be a Master Mason, our future members must come from the Blue Lodges. To assist with this effort, I have developed a program that can be used to give a presentation on Tall Cedars in your area. If you know Masons in other states, I encourage you to share it with them.

I will close by wishing everyone a healthy and enjoyable summer. Sue and I look forward to seeing everyone at the Convention later this year.

Over the past several months, your Foundation has approved more than \$67,500 in charitable assistance and program support. Through our Muscular Dystrophy Relief Fund (MDRF), we were honored to provide direct assistance to the families of Carson Webb, Jordyn Kuhn, and John Woodson. These grants help families meet real and immediate needs, ranging from adaptive equipment to accessible transportation and other expenses associated with living with MD, such as specialized arm supports, travel to and from specialized therapy, and doctor visits. therapy and specialized doctor visits.

In January, the Foundation approved a \$20,000 grant to Finn's Friends, an organization dedicated to improving the quality of life of children and families affected by Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. For many families, camp experiences once provided through MDA were among the most meaningful opportunities available to children living with muscular dystrophy. FOUNDATION IMPACT UPDATE

Helping Families When They Need It Most

The Tall Cedars Foundation continues to make a meaningful impact in the lives of individuals and families affected by muscular dystrophy.

Supporting the Webb Family

Earlier this year, the Foundation approved a \$5,000 MDRF grant to assist the family of Carson Webb, a 10-year-old diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. Carson's family is working to obtain a wheelchair-accessible van that will provide safer transportation and greater independence. The project is being coordinated through the Jett Foundation, with additional support from Finn's Friends and other generous donors. Carson's story is one example of how our Foundation helps bridge the gap between need and opportunity.

Supporting Jordyn Kuhn (sponsored by Juniata Valley Forest No. 88)

The Foundation also approved assistance for Jordyn Kuhn to provide accessible transportation and improve mobility for his family as they continue to care for Jordyn's ongoing needs.

Supporting John Woodson (sponsored by Richmond Forest No. 66)

In May, the Foundation approved a grant for John Woodson, a 24-year-old living with muscular dystrophy. The grant will help purchase specialized arm supports that will assist with occupational therapy, prevent contractures, reduce pain, and improve quality of life after insurance denied coverage for the equipment.

Partner Spotlight: Finn's Friends



The Tall Cedars Foundation proudly awarded a \$20,000 grant to Finn's Friends, a nonprofit organization founded by Dan and Paula Florczykowski in honor of their son, Finn, who lives with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. Finn's Friends works to improve the quality of life for children and families affected by muscular dystrophy through direct assistance, advocacy, and community support.

Partnerships like these allow the Tall Cedars Foundation to extend our reach and help even more families than we could alone.

Camp Promise: Bringing Camp Back to the MD Community



Many Tall Cedars remember the summer camps once offered through MDA. For countless families, those camps created lifelong memories, friendships, independence, and a chance to simply be a kid. Today, through our partnership with the Jett Foundation, we are helping bring those opportunities back.

The Tall Cedars Foundation recently approved a \$27,500 sponsorship of the Jett Foundation's **Camp Promise** program. Camp Promise provides barrier-free overnight camp experiences for individuals living with muscular dystrophy and other eligible neuromuscular disorders. Unlike many traditional programs that end when children reach adulthood, Camp Promise serves campers ages 13 and older, with some camp sessions specifically designed for older kids and adults ages 18 and above.

This August, **Camp Promise East** will be held in **Brackney, Pennsylvania**, where campers will enjoy accessible outdoor activities, friendships, independence-building experiences, and the opportunity to spend time with others who truly understand the challenges of living with neuromuscular disease.

Camp Promise is powered almost entirely by volunteers, and the Jett Foundation is always seeking counselors, medical professionals, activity leaders, and support staff to help create these unforgettable experiences. If you would like to learn more about volunteering, visit the Jett Foundation and explore Camp Promise opportunities.

If your Forest has relationships with children, teens, or adults living with muscular dystrophy or related neuromuscular diseases, please make them aware of these camp opportunities across the country. The magic of camp should not end simply because a child has grown older.

Article IX

C. Fees, Dues, Assessments

1. Annual Dues

b. PerCapita/TCF Assessment Late Fee

Any Constituent Forest that does not submit their annual PerCapita and TCF Assessment to the Supreme Forest by the deadline of March 31st of each year will be charged a late fee of 10% of the total of their PerCapita and TCF Assessment to be paid along with their PerCapita and TCF Assessment for that year. The late fee will be charged each year a Forest does not submit their PerCapita and TCF Assessment to the Supreme Forest by March 31st. If a Forest is delinquent in submitting their PerCapita and TCF Assessment to the Supreme Forest for two consecutive years their Forest's charter will be suspended.

Article IX- Constituent Forest

c. Fees,Dues and Assessments

1. Per Capita Tax and Assessments

a. All Constituent Forests shall pay into the treasury of the Supreme Forest thirteen dollars (\$13.00) seventeen dollars (\$17.00) PerCapita tax based on its membership as of December 31st of the previous year. 2013, seventeen dollars (17.00) on its membership as of 2014, and subsequent years. Each Constituent Forest shall pay into the Treasury of the Supreme Forest the four dollars (\$4.00) for each new member initiated into the Forest, affiliated with the Forest, and for each reinstated member, with the annual assessment.

By-Law Changes

ARTICLE VI--HEADGEAR

A. Type

1. The headgear for all Tall Cedars of Lebanon members and Officers shall be triangular and pyramidal in shape as heretofore adopted by the Supreme Forest. Pyramids should be clear of adornment, except for the Tall Cedar Foundation Life Membership Pin and the Supreme Forest Key Club Award Pin. If these pins are worn on the pyramid, they must be attached on the left side of the pyramid to retain the tassel. No other adornment or object of any kind shall be attached whatsoever without authorization by the Supreme Forest. (05)

B. Color and Trimmings (Effective June 1, 1990 - Pyramids currently in use may continue to be worn.)

1. General membership of a Constituent Forest not holding office-- Green Pyramid, Green Tassel, Green Trimming, Yellow Lettering/Forest Name & Number.
2. Elective Officers of Constituent Forests while in office--White Pyramid, Black Tassel, Black Trimming, Green Lettering/Forest Name & Number.
3. Grand Tall Cedar while in office--Red Pyramid, Yellow Tassel, Green Trimming, Yellow Lettering/Forest Name & Number.
4. Past Grand Tall Cedar--Red Pyramid, Green Tassel, Green Trimming, Yellow Lettering/Forest Name & Number.
5. Past Scribes and Treasurers of Constituent Forests who have served for three (3) years or more, and Trustees of Constituent Forests who have served for three (3) consecutive years or more, thus becoming members of the Supreme Forest--Red Pyramid, White Tassel, Yellow Trimming, Yellow Lettering/Forest Name & Number. (14)
6. Constituent Forest Chaplain Purple Pyramid, White Tassel, White Trimming, White Lettering/Forest Name & Number.
7. Senior Deputy STC, Junior Deputy STC, Supreme Scribe, Supreme Treasurer-- White Pyramid, Red Tassel, Gold Trimming, Red Lettering/Title of Office.
8. Supreme Director--White Pyramid, Red Tassel, Gold Trim, Red Lettering/Supreme Director.

9. Other Appointed Officers of the Supreme Forest while in office (except Supreme Chaplain) -White Pyramid, Red Tassel, Red Trimming, Red Lettering/Supreme Forest Officer.
10. Supreme Chaplain--White Pyramid, Purple Tassel, Purple Trimming, Red Lettering/Supreme Chaplain.
11. Supreme Tall Cedar while in office--White Pyramid, Gold Tassel, Gold Trimming, Red Lettering/Supreme Tall Cedar.
12. Past Supreme Tall Cedar--White Pyramid, White Tassel, Gold Trimming, Red Lettering/Past Supreme Tall Cedar.
13. Royal Rangers, Members of the Units and Bandsmen- -Yellow Pyramid, Green Tassel, Green Trimming, Red Lettering/Forest Name & Number.
14. Past Supreme Forest Elected Officer except the Supreme Tall Cedar--White Pyramid, Green Tassel, Gold Trimming, Red Lettering/Past Title of Office.
15. Any member of a Supreme Forest Standing Committee, who has served three (3) or more years in such capacities--White Pyramid, Green Tassel, Green Trimming, Red Lettering/Supreme Forest. (97)
- ~~16. Trustees of the Tall Cedar Foundation, while in office White Pyramid, Gray Tassel, Gray Trimming, Gray Lettering/Tall Cedar Foundation Trustee.~~
17. Any permanent member of the Supreme Forest who has served as a member of a Special Committee for three (3) years, shall be entitled to wear a White Pyramid, Green Tassel, Green Trimming, Red Lettering/Supreme Forest.
18. Director of the Tall Cedar Foundation, while in office White Pyramid, Gray Tassel, Silver Trimming, Silver Lettering/Tall Cedar Foundation Director.
19. Appointed Officers and Heads of Units of Constituent Forests--White Pyramid, Yellow Tassel, Black Trimming, Green Lettering/Forest Name & Number.
20. Chairman of the Tall Cedar Foundation, while in office--White Pyramid, Silver Tassel, Silver Trimming, Silver Lettering/Tall Cedar Foundation Chairman.
21. Past Director of the Tall Cedar Foundation--White Pyramid, Green Tassel, Silver Trimming, Silver Lettering/Tall Cedar Foundation Director.
- ~~22. Past Trustee of the Tall Cedar Foundation who has served three (3) years in such capacity--White Pyramid, Green Tassel, Gray Trimming, Gray~~

23. Any member of the Supreme Forest, who as a Past Supreme Forest Officer or Past District Deputy STC who has served three (3) or more years in such capacities--White Pyramid, Green Tassel, Trimming, Red lettering/Supreme Forest Officer.
24. Any member of a Constituent Forest who has served three (3) consecutive years as a Delegate - Green Pyramid, White Tassel, Green Trimming, Yellow Lettering/Forest and Number.
25. Grand Master - Blue Pyramid (medium blue), Yellow Tassel, Gold Trimming, Yellow Lettering/Grand Master and year(s) they served as Grand Master.
26. ~~Past Grand Master- Blue Pyramid (medium blue), White Tassel, Gold Trimming, Yellow Lettering/Past Grand Master.~~

26. Member at Large Pyramid-Green pyramid, Green Tassel, Green Trimming, Yellow Lettering, and Member at Large (where the Forest name and number would go)

- c. Constituent Forests will provide a pyramid to each Master Mason who is initiated as a Tall Cedar. The cost of the pyramid may be charged to the petitioner as part of the fee for initiation, if so, specified in the Forest By-laws.

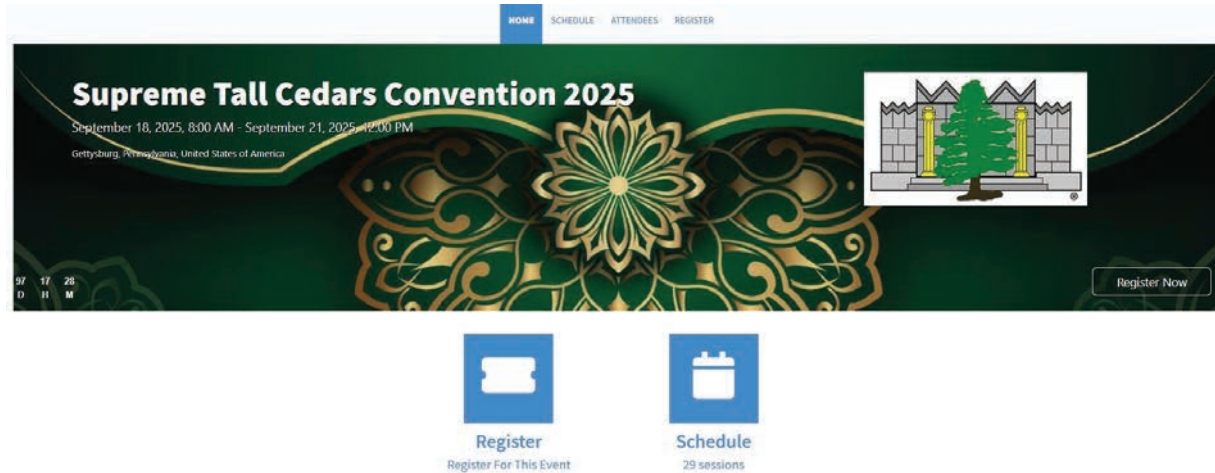

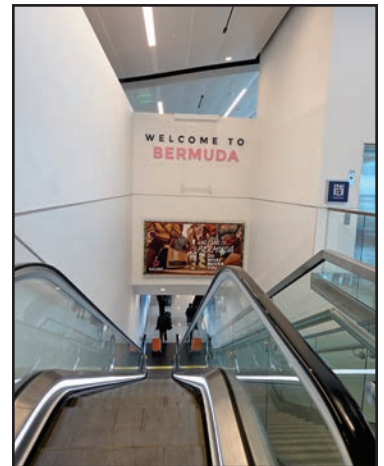
Peppercorn Celebration — Bermuda

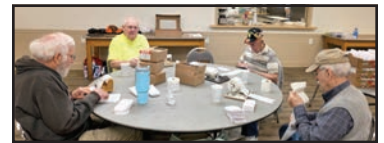
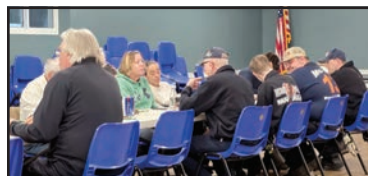

We hope to see you at convention in Gettysburg or come by to visit Har-Ce #142. We would love to have visitors from other Forests outside our District!



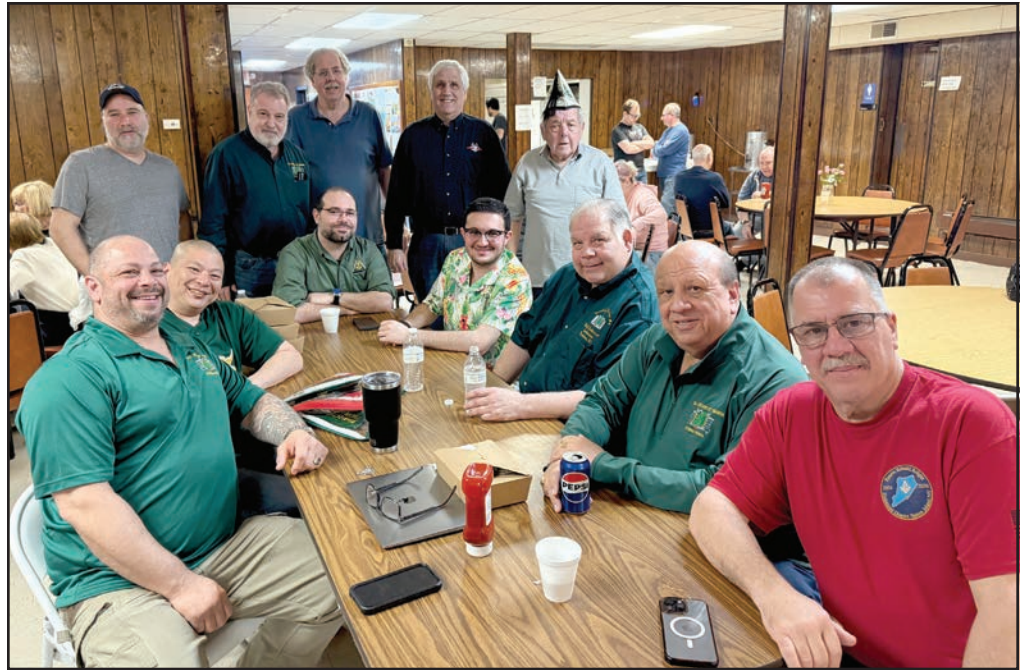

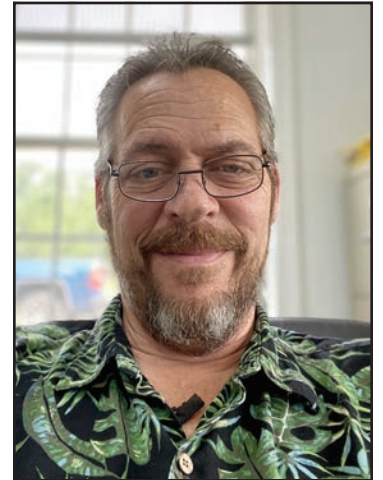
